

## ATTENDANCE—THE LAW

<u>Section 7 Education Act 1996</u> places a duty on parents to ensure that their child of compulsory school age receives a suitable education through regular attendance at school.

If a registered pupil of compulsory school age fails to attend school regularly, the parent could be guilty of an offence under section 444 Education Act 1996.

Schools also have a safeguarding duty, under <u>section 175 Education Act 2002</u>, to investigate any unexplained absences.

Please be aware that we will be querying non-attendance and making referrals to the Educational Inclusion and Partnership Team for persistent absence or extended absences.

#### PARKING AND THE HIGHWAY CODE

Please ensure you are respecting the Highway Code and modelling appropriate behaviour when parking near to the school.

Any breaches of the Home-School Agreement or Highway Code will be taken seriously.
