ATTENDANCE—THE LAW

[Section 7 Education Act 1996](#) places a duty on parents to ensure that their child of compulsory school age receives a suitable education through regular attendance at school.

If a registered pupil of compulsory school age fails to attend school regularly, the parent could be guilty of an offence under [section 444 Education Act 1996](#).

Schools also have a safeguarding duty, under [section 175 Education Act 2002](#), to investigate any unexplained absences.

Please be aware that we will be querying non-attendance and making referrals to the Educational Inclusion and Partnership Team for persistent absence or extended absences.

PARKING AND THE HIGHWAY CODE
