Our Lady's Catholic Primary School Year 1 Curriculum Newsletter: Spring Term





Each morning the children will continue to develop and practise their arithmetic skills during our RAM session. RAM begins at 8.45 so please make sure that your child arrives on time.

During Maths lessons, the children will focus on numbers and place value within 20 before moving to 50. Children will build upon their addition and subtraction skills before exploring length, height, mass and volume.

Reading, phonics and writing continues to be taught daily. SPaG skills are taught so that children can improve their written work through looking at word choices, punctuation and spelling. Reading lessons will focus on reading fluency and understanding. We will also explore fiction and nonfiction texts. This is further supported through our Power of Reading sequences where we explore new texts and authors. Modelled and shared writing lessons will focus on reading work to make sure it makes sense and starting to use punctuation correctly.

The children will be developing their understanding of the Weather along with seasonal changes. We will also be ordering and writing the months of the year to help with our science.

Kingdom



Our topic this term is Kingdom. The children will find out about the kingdom in which we live and its surrounding areas. Children will also learn about the people in charge of our kingdom both past and present.

Our Community topic will explore the special people in our lives and how they are there to help us. They will learn that in church we meet people who do special jobs as we celebrate the Good News of Jesus.

Our learning will then move to how the parish family gathers for the Eucharist (Mass), Jesus' special meal and how we find strength in gathering for the celebration of God's love in our lives.

We will then focus on Lent. Children will learn and understand that Lent is a time when we change and grow as we prepare for the celebration of Easter.

Humanities



This term's focus is Kingdoms. Learning will include using local maps, to identify continents and oceans around us. In History we will be looking at Kings and Queens of the United Kingdom.

Reading

Please listen to your child read every day to support them in becoming a fluent reader and to build their 'reading mileage'. Explaining the meaning of unfamiliar words and talking about the book will help your child process and understand what they are reading.

Reading to your child is a great way to model how a story should be read using expression, punctuation and intonation.

Children will bring home a Collins Little Wandle book matched to their phonetic ability. They may also have a sharing book to read with your support and a free choice book from our School Library.
