# **Our Lady's Catholic Primary School** Year 1 Curriculum Newsletter: Summer Term



This half term we are counting in 2s, 5s and 10s and beginning multiplication by adding equal groups, and division by sharing. We will find halves and guarters of shapes and amounts and look at position and direction, including left and right. In the second half of the term we will be looking at numbers to 100 in terms of tens and ones. We will be learning about money: recognising coins and notes and making amounts with coins. We will also be sequencing the days of the week and reading time on an analogue clock: o'clock and half past.

Reading, phonics and writing are taught daily. SPaG sessions teach the children how to improve their written work through a focus on word choices, punctuation and spelling. We will also study two new texts over the term through our Power of Reading sequences where we explore texts and authors. Modelled and shared writing lessons will focus on the children orally rehearsing sentences before writing. They will then read their written work to make sure it makes sense and is punctuated correctly.

In Science the children will be observing and finding out about plants. They will discover how a variety of seeds grow into plants and learn how to classify the different parts. We will also have the opportunity to plant our own seeds 🙂





Our topic this term is Explorers. The children will find out about their own country, other countries and oceans across the world.

We will investigate and interpret the past and find out about Christopher Columbus.

Children will begin the term by learning that Pentecost is a special celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit, through whom the risen life of Jesus is given.

Concentrating on choices in the light of our belief in a loving God, the children will learn that there are times when we need to acknowledge our sorrow for making wrong choices and that the Church offers the Sacrament of Reconciliation which celebrates God's unconditional love for us. Our final topic teaches about God's gift of diversity in the world and its people. Jesus in His life and Gospel, challenges people to appreciate diversity and to create with it a harmony that reflects the unity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This is reflected in the work of CAFOD, which the children will find out about.

Humanities This term's focus is Explorers. Learning will include using world maps, atlases, and globes to identify the United Kingdom, as well as other countries, continents, and oceans. We will investigate and interpret the past and find out about Christopher Columbus.



## **Creative Learning**

In Art We will be learn about the work of Henri Rousseau, concentrating on creating impressionist art works. In D.T we will be exploring different materials and constructing boats.
