Year 3 Curriculum Newsletter: Autumn Term 2023





We will start the term with a three-week unit on place value. This will be followed by a unit on addition and subtraction. For the remainder of the Autumn term, our focus will be on multiplication and division.




Reading, writing, phonics and SPaG continues to be taught daily. Reading lessons will focus on reading fluency, speed and accuracy as well as skills to further develop comprehension. This will be further supported through our Power of Reading teaching sequences, which focus on journeying through a text. Daily SPaG lessons will feed directly into our writing. Modelled and shared writing lessons lead to the children having the opportunity to plan, draft, edit and improve their writing.

Our focus is Rocks and Soil.

Children will explore different types of rocks and become rock detectives! They will then investigate how planet Earth has different layers of rocks. Later in the term, we will move on to studying Animals and Humans.

Ages and Stages



Over the course of the term, the children will look at life in Stone Age Britain. We will then look further afield at how continents and oceans have developed over time.
