Year 2 Curriculum Newsletter: Spring Term 2024





We will start the term by recapping how to use column method for Addition and Subtraction. We will then spend the remainder of the term looking at Addition Word Problems, Division, Missing Numbers and Fractions.

For the second half of the term we will help the children prepare for their assessments in May by continuing to help fill identified gaps in knowledge.

Reading, writing and spelling continues to be taught daily. Reading lessons will focus on segmenting and blending, reading fluency and accuracy as well as skills to further develop comprehension. This will be further supported through our Power of Reading teaching sequences which focus on journeying through a text. Modelled and shared writing lessons lead to the children planning, drafting, editing and improving their writing.

Our focuses this term are Materials and Plants. We will be exploring the different materials that objects are made from and the properties of materials. We will also explore what plants need to survive and we will observe them growing.



Around the world in 80 Days!

Our focus this term will be all about the world we live in!

We will be looking at different countries and how these are similar or different to the United Kingdom.

In DT we will be using new knowledge and skills to create frame structures.

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
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Our themes during PSHE lessons will focus upon keeping safe, appropriate touch and medicine safety.

Reading

Each day, your child will either bring home an Oxford Reading Tree book or a Little Wandle decodable book if they are receiving Phonics Teaching. Children should be able to read the book with around 90% accuracy. Daily reading practice at home will help your child to develop fluency skills which are the vital link between decoding and understanding. The 'Parent Tips' at the front of the book are a great quide for working through the book. Your child will choose a 'Reading for Pleasure' book from the Library. They may not be able to read this book independently so please enjoy reading it together. Reading to your child is a great way to help them engage with and develop a love of reading.
