Year 6 Curriculum Newsletter: Summer Term





We will start the term with a unit on the properties of shape where the focus will be angles. This will be followed by a unit on position and direction focusing on coordinates, translation and reflections.

For the second half of the term, our focus will be on consolidating and applying our learning through investigations and projects.



Reading lessons will focus on reading fluency, speed and accuracy as well as skills to further develop comprehension. Through our 'I'm a Clever Writer' scheme, the children will be applying their writing skills in a variety of genres including: biographies, narratives and setting descriptions. During SPAG sessions the children will focus on further spelling rules to support their writing.

Within Science the children will explore the heart and circulatory system and consider how lifestyle choices affect our health.
