# Year 3 Curriculum Newsletter: Summer Term



We will start the term with a two week unit on fractions. This will be followed by a unit on money and then time where we will focus on telling time to the nearest 5 minutes.

For the second half of the term, our focus will be on shape and statistics.



Reading, writing and SPaG continues to be taught daily. Reading lessons will focus on reading fluency, speed and accuracy as well as skills to further develop comprehension. This will be further supported through our Clever Writer teaching sequences, which focus on journeying through a text. Through these modelled and shared writing lessons, it leads to the children having the opportunity to plan, draft, edit and improve their writing.

Our focus is plants and flowers and making connections. Children will learn what plants need to grow. They will develop understanding through practical science experiments. We will also bring together learning from all of our science topics to make connections.





# How has Wellingborough changed over the years?

The key question above will be our focus for this term on which our learning will be based. We are hoping to explore the local area and see first-hand how changes have affected Wellingborough.

**Reminders PE days:** Monday and Friday. Full PE kit to be worn to school.

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**Pentecost**: We will be learning about Pentecost and that the gift of the Holy Spirit gives us the energy and the power to live the way of Jesus.

**Special Places**: We will be thinking about special places we each have, as well as looking at special places for Christians. We will examine why these places are special.

This term's focus is '*Changes in Wellingborough*'. In Geography we will look at the changes to human and physical features in the local area. History will focus on significant changes to the town and the impact on residents.

# Creative Learning


Impressionism. We will use various techniques to create local *'Cityscapes'* of Wellingborough.

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# PSHE




Our themes during PSHE lessons will focus upon 'Being My Best' and 'Changing and Growing' We will look at relationships and developing empathy.
