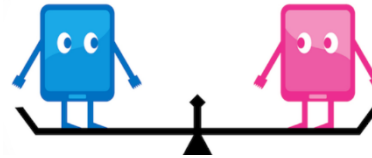
Year 2 Curriculum Newsletter: Autumn 2025



M A T H S

We will begin the year by focusing on Place Value. Through these lessons, children develop an understanding of the place value of each digit in 2-digit numbers. This is supported by representations including Place Value Counters and Base 10 blocks. Children also learn to read and write numbers written in words. Children then learn to exchange ones for tens which is fundamental for the following calculation units. We will then focus on telling the time to 5 minutes, including using digital clocks. Fractions and Geometry will conclude the term.

Creation and Covenant: Pupils will learn the story of Noah, focusing on God's promise, or covenant, with Noah and with all creatures. Like other stories at the beginning of the book of Genesis, it speaks of humanity's relationship with God and the hope that flows from God. **Prophecy and Promise:** This branch focuses on Jesus' infancy. Telling the story from St. Luke's Gospel about Zachariah in the temple and concluding with the period of Advent as the preparation of the coming of Christ.

English

Reading skills will continue to be developed through a range of learning opportunities during our phonics and reading group sessions. Immersive Reading sessions will focus on the texts: *The Emperor's Egg* and *Grace and Family* and will allow the children to engage with the story, explore themes and issues and develop creative responses.

Clever Writer lessons focus on the development of skills (ingredients) required to write. Writing checklists are used daily so that children practise, apply and embed skills that are taught. All sessions are based around the weekly text which enables children to write for different purposes. This will begin with retelling stories and writing diary entries.

Humanities



In Geography, the children will be able to name and locate the seven continents of the world. They will identify hot and cold places and make comparisons between the UK and Kenya. In History, children will develop their investigative skills using sources from the past to explore how school life has changed over the last 100 years. They will also compare their own experiences of school to those of children in the past.

Creative Learning



In Art, children will explore drawing techniques using a range of materials and develop tonal shading skills. This will allow them to make choices in order to create a given effect. In DT, children will learn about the main food groups and name foods that belong to these. They will be able to discuss the importance of a balanced diet and construct a healthy wrap.

SCIENCE

The children will learn about the basic survival needs of animals and the life cycles of different animal groups. We will also focus on staying healthy. In Term 2, children will explore materials, carrying out investigations to find out which material is suitable for specific purposes.

Ways to Help Your Child at Home



Reading

To encourage your child to become a lifelong reader, it is important that reading experiences are regular and positive.

Reading to your child, sharing books with and listening to your child read with lots of praise and encouragement is so valuable.

If your child is following our Little Wandle Phonics programme they will bring home a fully decodable Big Cat book. If your child has completed the programme they will be reading from our Oxford Reading Tree scheme before moving to our selection of Free Readers.

Please listen to your child read at least three to four times per week and record this in the Reading Record. Children will also bring home a free choice book from our School Library to share and read with your help.
