EYFS Curriculum Newsletter: Summer Term 2025



This term we will continue to subitise (recognise quantities without counting) up to 10 through practical games and equipment such as dice and dominoes. We will be recalling and writing number bonds up to 10. We will be comparing quantities, exploring greater than and less than as well as using mathematical language to compare and talk about shape and size. We will also be completing simple addition and subtraction sums.



This term our focus texts will be: 'Yucky Worms', 'Arrrrhhggg Spider', 'What the Ladybird Heard' and 'Handa's Surprise'. We will be focusing on story structure and vocabulary. The children will be creating their own stories using new vocabulary and knowledge that has been learnt. We will be writing simple sentences, captions, lists and instructions that can be read by others and themselves. We will also be starting handwriting lessons in preparation for Year 1.

Physical development

We will be continuing our weekly PE lessons on a Tuesday morning. We will be negotiating space and obstacles safely as well as developing strength and balance. Children will have the opportunity to explore our PE apparatus to develop these skills.

We will also be developing our fine motor skills further to enable good pencil grip and control. We will be using small tools effectively including scissors, paintbrushes and cutlery.

This term we will be continuing to learn about the special events of Easter and focus on the Ascension story. We will discuss how the Apostles felt when Jesus returned to Heaven. We will also be learning about Pentecost and how Jesus sent the Holy Spirit. We will be creating artwork inspired by the flames of the Holy Spirit. We will be continuing to embed our mission statement 'Love one another as I have loved you' into everything we do and reflecting on how we can live our lives as Jesus wants us to. We will join in with collective worship through whole school assemblies and Church services.

Understanding the World



Our Forest sessions will continue into the Summer Season, giving us opportunities to observe the final change in season this year. We will be focusing on comparisons of environments and using maps and atlases to learn about different countries. The Children will be learning about historical events and how things were different in the past.

Expressive Arts and Design



The Children will be given the opportunity to partake in creative activities including: junk modelling, cooking, painting, crafting as well as collaborative art. The Children will be learning to perform songs, rhymes and poems and try to move in time to music.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be trying new activities to build our confidence and show independence, resilience and perseverance in the face of challenge. We will be improving our focused attention for longer lengths of time during both independent and guided tasks to prepare children for the transition to Year 1.



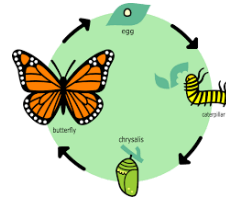
Home Learning Activities

When you have completed a task please send a photo on class dojo or bring it into school to share with the class.

Go on a bug hunt, draw pictures and label the bugs you find.

Ways to Help Your Child at Home



Reading

To encourage your child to become a lifelong reader, it is important that reading experiences are regular and positive. Reading to your child, sharing books with and listening to your child read with lots of encouragement and praise are so valuable. If your child is following our Little Wandle Phonics programme they will bring home a fully decodable Big Cat book. If your child has completed the programme they will be reading from our Oxford Reading Tree scheme before moving to our selection of Free Readers.

Please listen to your child read at least three to four times per week and record this in the Reading Record.

Children will also bring home a free choice book from our School Library to share and read with your help.
